NEWS FROM THE PRESIDENT

- Greeting from the National FCE Board, we have just finished a very successful board meeting and we are all excited about the plans that were made. Plans were finalized for the 2012 Conference in Northern Kentucky. There is lots of information in this issue. Fargo, North Dakota is the site for the 2013 conference and Tucson, Arizona has been chosen for 2014.
- There will be a memorial service to honor deceased board members and state presidents at the National FCE Annual Conference. If you have not turned in the names of your deceased state presidents they can still be honored. Please send the name, state and years served as state president and/or National board position and years served on National board to National FCE Headquarters by April 15.
- At the 2011 Conference Bonnie Teeples Oregon, was elected President Elect, Betty Schalk Missouri, was elected Vice President for Public Policy Victoria Schmidt Colorado was elected Secretary, Ardyce Snyder North Dakota was elected Central Region Public Policy Coordinator, Rita Charlton Vermont was elected Atlantic Region Program Coordinator, and Anne Engen Oregon was elected Pacific Region Program Coordinator. Susan Yee Hawaii was appointed to a 1 year term as Pacific Region Public Policy Coordinator. We welcome these women to the National FCE Board. The proposed bylaw amendments all passed, the new 2012 National FCE Bylaws are on our website, www.nafce.org.
- Statistics from the 2011 Annual Conference ~ 115 full time registrants, plus 11 board members and 5 on site committee members. 24 delegates, 46 first timers, 9 1-day registrants, 21 alumni and 3 past presidents. Dollar amounts collected during the conference: Silent Auction ~ \$992.00, FCE Sales ~ \$4,078.45, Coins for Friendship ~ \$272.11, Dollars for Leadership ~ \$221.00 and 167 books were donated to the Children's Hospital in Aurora.

The **2012 On Site committee**: Bonnie Teeples OR Chair, Sandy Medeiros MA, Office Manager, Scott Teeples OR, AV, Bonnie Russell KS, Sales and Silent Auction, Amber Phelan MO and Debbie Moos ND sub committee. **2013 On Site Chair** is Joan Gever ND.
- NEW MEMBERS ~ National FCE headquarters should receive the names of new members within one month of joining. The county treasurer can email or postal mail the name, address, phone number and type of membership (no dues) as soon as they receive them, so the new member can receive the welcome packet and materials. Then send dues and forms to state in the usual manner. The secretary at National FCE headquarters will check to be sure the new member's name is on the state's data base that is sent with dues.
- MEMBERSHIP CARDS ~ Membership cards are on the cover of the FCE Today this issue. This is your permanent membership card, we suggest laminating it. Cards will be available for a fee in the future.
- The CHARACTER COUNTS! Essay and Artwork contest for 4th graders runs from September 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012. Students' essays and pencil drawings must illustrate the Pillar of Character ~ Citizenship. State Presidents received the contest information at the Annual Conference.
- FINANCES ~ We have been able to work within our income for the last 2 years without transfers. The board continues to look at ways to cut back on expenses. Despite our vigilance, it will be necessary to transfer money from our reserves before the end of the year to cover our day to day expenses. This is a temporary fix at best. We all need to work on ways to fix this ~ adding new members, increase our dues, get personal and business sponsors.

The National FCE Annual Conference will be held at the Holiday Inn Airport, Erlanger, KY July 19 to 22. We are pleased to announce that we were able to keep the one day registration fee at \$125, and full conference registration at \$345. If you purchase the Friday 1 day registration, the Thursday evening opening ceremonies are included. Five (5) meals are included in the registration fee. We have also negotiated a reasonable hotel rate of \$93 max quad (4) occupancy.

President's Day will be held on Thursday July 19, with practice for the opening ceremony, presidents meeting, lunch and tour. The president's meeting is open to all who are registered. Thursday evening is the opening ceremonies with presentation of State Presidents and the National FCE Board.

Action Alert from Identity Theft Workshop

The writer/teachers for the conference workshop titled "Are You Smarter Than An Identity Thief?" printed out a small booklet of actions and alerts. Professionals in the fight against ID theft had recommended to the teachers that you don't sign the back of your credit cards but instead write **Photo ID required**. After the class we learned some business may reject the unsigned card at the request of their credit card processing companies. If the unsigned card is used in a fraud, the merchant will not receive the money due them.

So on the back of your card write **Photo ID** required/ then sign name. When charging something see if they ask for your photo ID. If they don't, ask them if they read what was written.

DUES INCREASE CHALLENGE

FCE members were challenged at the 2011 Conference in Colorado to donate money equal to a dues increase of .50 cents. A .50 cent dues increase would raise about \$2750. Whatever money is donated will be matched. What could we do with that money? We could print 4 FCE Friends storybooks that are waiting to be published. We could purchase archival material for storage. We could print additional Hearth Fires. We could train more leaders. We could replace an 8 year old copier. We could send our President to ACWW in India. We could publish a manuscript that was donated to National FCE. We couldn't do everything on our wish list, but this lets you know some of our needs. So far we have raised \$270 towards the increase.
