It's time to think about the 81st National FCE Annual Conference in Omaha, Nebraska, July 13-16, 2017. Nebraska's state insect is the honeybee . . . we want you to "BEE' all you can 'BEE' with FCE."

Changes are coming to Conference this year. FCL leadership classes will be presented in three sessions as before, but only twice instead of three times, leaving a class slot free each hour for a fun activity. **Bring an old oversized t-shirt with you to Conference.** You are going to be cutting it up; don't bring anything that is precious to you. There will be other activities to be determined soon.

For our service project, bring items for children (books, small games, socks, etc.) – we'll be stuffing totes for abused children who are in shelters. These children could be runaways at some point and likely to be targets for traffickers. Our organization has always been an advocate for children. Let's have bags overflowing!!!

While attending Conference, you will renew old friendships, make new ones, receive new material to take home, and overall just have a great time. Conference registration form and hotel reservation information are included in this newsletter. Be sure to make your hotel reservations before <u>JUNE 9</u>. This is our cutoff date for our group rate.

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In addition to the cost-cutting changes outlined in the last newsletter, we have made changes at National FCE Headquarters in Florence, KY. Judy Jones, our very efficient Office Manager, is now working three days a week (Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday). National FCE leases two suites for office space and two suites for storage. Effective April 30, we will be releasing the two suites used for storage, incorporating our storage items into one of the office suites currently being leased. This move will save National FCE \$500/month plus the utilities on the separate storage suites.

Another large expense for National FCE is the printing, labeling and mailing of our newsletter. Another avenue for distributing the newsletter is to email it to members. However, not all members have access to computers or email accounts. A question: What if the newsletter was emailed to the presidents of each local club and those presidents print out the newsletter for each of their club members? The cost of printing would be nominal for each club and relieve National of about \$12,000 per year. This is something we can discuss at Conference in July.

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The President-elect, Vice President for Public Policy, Secretary, and two educational coordinator positions are posted for election at Conference this year. The job descriptions for these positions are listed in this newsletter. Serving on the National FCE Board lets you step out of your comfort zone, allowing growth and inspiration. Submit your nomination forms today to Jeanne Purich or Sharon Giacometti. Their contact info is on our website.

Looking forward to seeing each of you in Omaha – let's make this one of the largest Conferences National FCE has had in a long time.

Descriptions of the positions posted for election at the 2017 National FCE Annual Conference taken from National FCE Bylaws are as follows:

The duties of the President-elect shall be to:

- A. Prepare for the office of President;
- B. Assist the President and perform all assigned duties during the one year term of office;
- C. Serve with vote on the Executive Committee and Board;
- D. Represent FCE at meetings as the President deems necessary

The duties of the Vice President for Public Policy shall be to:

- A. Serve as an aide to the President in all assigned duties;
- B. Direct the activities of the Public Policy Coordinators;
- C. Coordinate the Family Community Leadership program
- D. Assist states in promoting and strengthening the Family Community Leadership program;
- E. Perform the duties of the President in the event of the resignation, disability or death of the President and Vice President for Program until the next meeting of the Executive Committee;
- F. Serve as co-chair and coordinate the efforts of the Education Committee

The duties of the Secretary shall be to:

- A. Keep records of all meetings of FCE, the FCE Board and the Executive Committee and to distribute minutes within 60 days of the close of the meeting;
- B. Serve as chairman of the Credentials Committee and ascertain the number of voting delegates present by calling the roll of affiliated state associations at the business meetings of the annual conference;
- C. Perform any other secretarial duties as assigned by the President and/or the Executive Committee;
- D. The official minutes of all national meetings and other pertinent written material shall be deposited in archives at FCE National Headquarters following the administration of each National FCE President.

The duties of the Program Coordinator shall be to:

- A. Serve as a member of the Education Committee;
- B. Plan and coordinate programs at the annual conference as assigned;
- C. Attend meetings of the FCE Board;
- D. Attend and report on other meetings as a representative of National FCE as requested by the President;

- E. Encourage, receive and consider recommendations from state affiliated associations;
- F. Provide information, resources and/or direction to states based on goals and objectives of the Education Committee

The duties of the Public Policy Coordinator shall be to:

- A.. Serve as a member of the Education Committee;
- B. Plan and coordinate public policy education at the annual conference as assigned by the President;
- C. Attend meetings of the FCE Board;
- D. Attend and report on other meetings as a representative of National FCE as requested by the President;
- E. Encourage, receive and consider recommendations from state affiliated associations;
- F. Provide information, resources and/or direction to states based on goals and objectives of the Education Committee

SPIRIT OF FCL

The winner is everyone that has spirit, but the Spirit of FCL is a very special award that is given to a FCL trained individual or team of individuals.

The application for the Spirit of FCL demonstrates the use of the 30 hours or more of FCL training by providing education and leadership to a community group or activity beyond the membership of FCE. The nomination form must clearly indicate the community action as well as the involvement of the nominee. This form is available on our website: NAFCE.org.

There may be one nomination per state and these applications must be postmarked by April 15, 2017 and submitted to the National FCE headquarters.

Look around your community and take notice of the special things being done by FCE members or an individual/ group that have received their 30 hours of FCL training and send an application into your state president to nominate that person for this very special award.

LINE UP OF FCL LESSONS

The FCL line up of lessons for the 2017 National FCE Conference being held in Omaha, NE is as follows:

<u>Character Begins At Home</u> will be presented by Phyllis Narus and Martha Crawford – The promoting of good, strong ethical values starts at home. Attendees will become reacquainted with the 6 pillars of Character Counts, FCE Friends and Story Books and how they can help build character.

What Are Your Medications Telling You is being presented by Sally Bowman and Jeanne Purich – This lesson will help you understand how your medications interact with other medications and food that you consume. It will touch on the increasing opioid addiction that is growing in this country.

Being Your Best Everyday will give you skills to become comfortable speaking in public by refreshing memories or update the public opinion of what helps us to make the best impression in the first 30 seconds. Family Community Leadership Programs

The FCL program is twofold:

The first fold is getting your FCL Leader Certificate which is obtained after you complete 30 hours of FCL training.

The second fold is the 60 hour FCL Trainer Certification which can be received after you have gotten your 30 hour FCL Leader Certificate. The 60 hour trainer certificate requires the applicant to do 20 hours of actual teaching/training using the FCL model of team teaching, 20 hours of community action and 20 hours in public policy.

To document the necessary hours for the teaching category please list the topic taught, where, dates and length of presentation (which can include your prep time); for community action and public policy list how you were involved, dates and length of time.

Some suggestions on how to get your 60 hour training:

Serve on a non-profit board
Attend a City Council or school board meeting
Attend a state legislative meeting
Write a letter to the editor of the newspaper
Help with 4-H events
Volunteer to help at the nursing home
Volunteer to help at the school or sporting events
Write to your representative or senator
Organize and perform a community service project
Serve on committees at your church
Run for an elected office

After you have all of the required hours please send all of the documentation along with your filled out application to National FCE Headquarters.
