

CHARACTER TRAIT- FAIRNESS



Fairness is a strength within the Justice virtue. Those strong in fairness, believe that all people have value, and they are likely to approach situations with an objective and unbiased mindset and treat everyone with respect.

Fairness is a commonly used word to describe how people should behave in relation to one another. It's generally something used by people who have less than they feel like they deserve. But everyone has a different definition of fairness. For some people, fairness is matter equality. Everyone gets treated the same. For others, fairness is about being treated better. They believe things are fair if they are treated well. But it's obvious that's not really the truth. Some believe it's a legal definition. If something is illegal, it is fair to punish the person committing the act. But legal terms don't take feelings and needs into consideration.

So, what is fairness? The Rules Fairness is like a contract or a deal that people make with each about how to behave. The best way to decide what is fair is to sit down beforehand and talk about what to expect from each other. In a classroom, the teacher expects good behavior, respect, and understanding from the students. The students, in turn, expect patience, care, knowledge, and protection from the teacher. This behavior expectation becomes the basis for the behavior required in any location. Breaking the deal is unfair. "Sharing is Caring" We've all heard the importance of learning to share. Everyone gets a try at the new video game. Everyone gets some food. Everyone gets a cookie and a hug. Valuing people enough to give them their fair share is important to maintain good relationships, honesty, and happiness for all. Sharing isn't just a kindergarten activity to make sure all the kids can play. It's how people of all ages and backgrounds make friends and take care of each other.

Remember that fairness doesn't always mean equality. Sometimes, fairness depends on people's needs.

RAK: Random Acts of Kindness


