FCE Needs YOU!

National FCE is again looking for qualified candidates for positions on the National FCE Board. Positions open for the 2014 election are President Elect, Vice President for Public Policy, Secretary, Central Region Public Policy Coordinator, and Atlantic Region Program Coordinator. Nominations for each position shall be mailed to National FCE Headquarters, and the National FCE Secretary with a postmark 60 days before the first day of conference, which this year will be May 15, 2014

The National FCE Nominating Committee Chairman is Scott Teeples, Pacific Region Program Coordinator, with a committee of the following State FCE Presidents; Jodie Brubacher, Colorado; Mary Lou Burch, Tennessee; Betty Goldammer, Michigan; and Cathy McKown, Nebraska. If you are interested in running for a National FCE office, you may contact any of the committee members and they will send you a packet.

Qualifications for office state that each candidate shall be a member in good standing and shall have agreed in writing to the nomination. A candidate shall be serving or have previously served as an appointed or elected officer of her/his state affiliate or have served on the National FCE Board within the preceding eight years. A candidate shall have completed any term of office in the state affiliate or FCE by January 1 of the year following election at National FCE Conference. An officer may not resign from a presently held position in order to run for another FCE position. An individual appointed to fill a vacancy shall be eligible to run for an elected position. A candidate for President Elect shall have served on the National FCE Board within the preceding eight years. A candidate for Vice President for Public Policy shall have served on the National FCE Board within the preceding eight years and be experienced in this organization's public policy program. A candidate for Secretary shall understand the importance of preserving the official records of FCE, have the ability to write accurate minutes, and provide a safe repository for official records. A candidate for Program Coordinator shall have experience in educational program planning. A candidate for Public Policy Coordinator shall be experienced in this organization's public policy program. (National FCE Bylaws, Article V, Section 2).

Serving on the National Board is an opportunity for personal growth, serving an organization you believe in and forming lifetime friendships. We ask in return for your commitment of time, effort and loyalty.

The Nominating Committee looks forward to receiving nominations from qualified individuals in each State. Join the board and help us move FCE forward.

Tour A. 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Enjoy an exciting day discovering the magic of the Southwest, beginning with a visit to the "White Dove of the Desert", the Mission San Xavier Del Bac, where you'll see the Spanish influence in this world famous cathedral. You'll enjoy shopping for one-of-a kind artistic creations and jewelry at Sahuartia's copper mine before dining in an authentic Mexican/American restaurant in a scenic setting. You may see a javalina at the Arizona-Sonora desert museum before we finish our full day with a scenic drive through saguaro cactus at the only place in the world where they grow. You'll also see prehistoric petroglyphs if you have a sharp eye.

Our tour will lead us northwest from the city and see the open spaces of AZ. We will visit the Casa Grande Ruins and enjoy a video describing the history of the area. Hope on the Horizon

What do you see for the future of the National Association for Family and Community Education (FCE) at the National, State and Local level? Do you believe that the end of FCE is coming soon? Once you have your new members signed up, it is very important that you keep them active. Involve them in all of the activities that they feel comfortable with.

There are three very important things that each and every new member needs. Those include:

- 1. Every new member will need a friend.
- 2. Every new member needs an assignment.
- 3. Every new member needs love and nurturing from all of the FCE members and the FCE organization.

Use all of the resources you have available to Find, Recruit and Retain new members. With your help there is Hope on the Horizon for FCE.
